The papers of Mary French Sheldon, author, lecturer, and explorer, were given to the Library of Congress by Sheldon's estate in 1947.

Processing History

The papers of Mary French Sheldon were arranged and described in 1960. A container list was produced in 1986. The collection was rehoused and described in 2003, and the finding aid was revised in 2010.

Transfers

Two nitrate negative motion picture films have been transferred to the Motion Picture, Broadcasting, and Recorded Sound Division where they are identified as part of the Mary French Sheldon Papers.

Scope and Content Note

The papers of Mary French Sheldon (1847-1936) span the years 1885-1938. The collection consists of correspondence, writings, lectures, notes, clippings, an address book, drawings, awards, menus, books, photographs, passports, scrapbooks, and miscellaneous material primarily concerning Sheldon's interest in Africa, particularly the Belgian Congo. Also included is correspondence relating to her travels and lectures; fictional writings; translations of various works, including *Salammbo* by Gustave Flaubert; an unpublished work relating to the Congo; drawings by Shelton; and photographs of various subjects, especially Africa. Correspondents include Henry Morton Stanley, Albert I, King of the Belgians, and several of Albert's cabinet ministers.
