Scope and Content Note

The papers of John Calvin Leonard (1859-1937) span the years 1882-1920 and consist mainly of diaries together with a testimonial and newspaper clippings. The first diary contains fourteen pages of a journal written on the *Juniata* (screw sloop), 1882. Other diaries reflect service matters such as cruises, engineering problems, the use of liquid fuel oil on naval ships, and the navy's role in the Spanish-American War and in World War I. They also contain materials on family matters, sports, plays, and concerts; social, political, and economic matters; the Russian Revolution; and the rise of labor unions. The collection is organized by type of material.
