Scope and Content Note

The papers of Nancy Pelosi (1940-) span the years 1930-2012 with the bulk of the material dating from 1987 to 2010. The papers are organized into the following series: <u>Administrative File</u>, <u>Constituent File</u>, <u>Correspondence</u>, <u>Digital Files</u>, <u>Events and Scheduling</u>, <u>Leadership File</u>, <u>Legislative File</u>, <u>Personal File</u>, <u>Political File</u>, and <u>Press and Communications</u>. Withdrawn series include <u>Restricted</u>, <u>Closed</u>, <u>Classified</u>, <u>North Atlantic Treaty Organization</u>, and <u>Oversize</u>.

Although a small amount of family and personal papers are found in the Personal File and scattered throughout the Correspondence series, the Pelosi papers are focused on her service in the United States Congress starting in 1987, and document her historic role as the first woman Speaker of the House and her activities in other Democratic leadership positions. The papers represent a broad range of Pelosi's congressional activities, including political actions, budget and legislative processes, public appearances and speeches, and routine administrative duties. Many file groupings were created and used by staff members and have been maintained and identified with the staff member's name. Notable staff members with identified files include former chiefs of staff Carolyn A. Bartholomew, John A. Lawrence, Judith Lemons, Terri McCullough, and Catlin O'Neill. Other staff members with prominent files are Dean Aguillen, Scott Boule, Amy Fuerstenau, Jerry Hartz, Lara Levison, Lori Pepper, and Carlos Sanchez. The collection is highly interconnected; files related to a particular topic may be found in more than one location.

The <u>Administrative File</u> represents Pelosi's San Francisco and Washington, D.C., office operations and staff. Calendars, call and visitor logs, contact lists, staff lists, job descriptions, staff manuals as well as some individual chief of staff files document the workings of the offices. Also included here are files regarding Pelosi's office facilities in San Francisco and Washington, D.C., as well as some material on the organization of Pelosi's first congressional office in 1988.

The <u>Constituent File</u> concerns Pelosi's work for her home district in San Francisco and the Bay Area of California, variously numbered as the 5th, 8th, and 12th districts. Prominent file groups document Pelosi's role in establishing and maintaining national parks in the San Francisco Bay area, her concerns with the economic and environmental issues surrounding the closure of military bases in her district, and her commitment to the improvement of water resources and transportation networks in northern California. The series is organized into ten subseries: <u>Alphabetical File</u>, <u>Golden Gate National Recreation Area</u>, <u>Grants</u>, <u>Hunters Point Naval Shipyard</u>, <u>Maritime National Historical Park</u>, <u>Predecessors</u> (files from the previous Congressional representatives, John L. Burton, Phillip Burton, and Sala Galant Burton), <u>Presidio</u>, <u>Transportation</u>, <u>Treasure Island</u>, and <u>Water Resources</u>.

The <u>Correspondence</u> series is largely arranged as received from Pelosi's office. The correspondence groups created by her staff have been maintained as subseries with the addition of a Miscellaneous correspondence subseries for loose correspondence that was not connected to another file. The <u>Alphabetical</u> and the <u>Chronological</u> subseries contain an assortment of correspondents; top government officials, international leaders, fellow members of Congress, California citizens, and personal friends are all represented in these files. Formal congressional correspondence is in the <u>Co-signed Letters</u> and <u>Dear Colleague Letters</u> subseries. A set of form letter responses that were used by Pelosi's staff comprises the <u>Issue Mail</u> subseries. Other Correspondence subseries are <u>Miscellaneous</u>, <u>Recommendation Letters</u>, <u>Reports and Logs</u>, <u>Thank You Letters</u>, and <u>White House</u>.

The <u>Digital Files</u> series is in two subseries: General Files and Withdrawn Files from the Paper Files. The <u>General Files</u> were copied from the Pelosi office's server and are independent of the paper files. These files are primarily staff files, events, scheduling, press and communications, and House Democratic Caucus material. <u>Withdrawn Files from the Paper Files</u> are from digital storage media removed from paper files in the course of processing and are primarily image and video files. A cross reference to the original location in the paper files is provided for each of the Withdrawn Files.

The <u>Events and Scheduling</u> series has two subseries. The <u>Chronological</u> subseries documents Pelosi's many speaking appearances, fundraisers, meetings, conferences and other events. The chronologically arranged folders usually include planning material, speech notes, and items from the event. Itineraries, schedules, and calendars are also included in this subseries as well as a large file for the 2009 Presidential inauguration. The <u>Speeches</u> subseries is primarily composed of the files of staff speech writers.

The <u>Leadership File</u> focuses on Pelosi's campaigns for House leadership positions: democratic whip, minority leader and Speaker of the House. The series documents her assumption of these positions as well as many of the duties and activities specific to the leadership position.

The <u>Legislative File</u> is the largest series in the collection. The file reflects her work with various committees and caucuses including the appropriations, ethics, and intelligence committees and the House Democratic Caucus. The series documents the wide range of legislative issues and priorities that came before the House of Representatives. The files of Pelosi's director of floor operations, Jerry Hartz, is in a separate Floor Operations subseries and is arranged as received. Early in her House career, Pelosi formed a congressional working group on China, which is also documented in this series as are files on her various trips with congressional delegations. The series is divided into nine subseries: <u>Appropriations</u>, <u>Committees and Caucuses</u>, <u>Congressional Delegations</u>, <u>Congressional Working Group on China</u>, <u>Floor Operations</u>, <u>Floor Statements</u>, <u>Issues File</u>, <u>Legislative Activity Guides</u>, and <u>Staff Files</u>.

The <u>Personal File</u> includes biographical material, files about awards received, Pelosi's involvement with non-congressional organizations and conferences, financial documents, and family papers, including items concerning her father, Thomas D'Alesandro, the former mayor of Baltimore, Maryland. Personal, professional, family, and miscellaneous photographs are also found in the Personal File.

Papers in the <u>Political File</u> relate to Pelosi's political campaigns, her fundraising trips and events, and her part in national Democratic politics. As a House leader, Pelosi played a role in crafting political messaging for the Democratic party. Files for the Democratic National Committee and the Democratic Congressional Campaign Committee document Pelosi's

prominent role in national party politics. Additionally, this series has files concerning California politics, including the recall election of Governor Gray Davis.

The <u>Press and Communications</u> series contains both press coverage of Pelosi and her office's official communications. Included are news clippings, mailers, press releases, statements, editorials, transcripts of press conferences and interviews, website information, and contacts lists. Files relating to Pelosi's memoir *Know Your Power* are also in this series.

BOX 1-19

Administrative File, 1981-2012

Papers describing Pelosi's San Francisco and Washington D.C. office operations and staff. Staff lists and job descriptions, call and visitor logs, calendars, contact lists, materials pertaining to various office facilities, supplies and website administration, files created by several chiefs of staff, office staff manuals prescribing handling of constituent mail, filing, keeping logs, giving tours, and scheduling. Also included are correspondence, timelines, and press releases related to the construction of Pelosi's San Francisco office.

BOX 19-101

Constituent File, 1967-2011

Files pertaining to Pelosi's work on behalf of her constituency in San Francisco and the Bay Area. The Constituent file documents Pelosi's efforts to address a variety of constituent interests, paramount among them, to establish and maintain national parks in the San Francisco Bay area, improve transportation and water networks around the region, and address economic and environmental concerns surrounding the closure of military bases in her district particularly the remediation and reuse plans for the Presidio, Naval Station Treasure Island, and Hunter's Point Naval Shipyard. Pelosi's work to establish the Presidio as a historic site co-managed by the Presidio Trust and the National Park Service under the Presidio Trust Act of 1996 is the most comprehensively documented project within this series. Project files include correspondence, bills, amendments, statements, testimonies, reports, and clippings.

Arranged alphabetically into ten subseries: Alphabetical File, Golden Gate National Recreation Area, Grants, Hunters Point Naval Shipyard, Maritime National Historical Park, Predecessors, Presidio, Transportation, Treasure island, and Water Resources.

BOX 19-33

Alphabetical File, 1985-2011

Files relating to various places, institutions, organizations, events, branches of local government, and programs in and around San Francisco, the Bay Area, and the state of California. These files primarily represent staff vertical files from the early to late 2000s. Prominent topics include the Medi-Cal health care service redesign of 2005, the San Francisco Old Mint Commemorative Coin Act in 2006, and national marine sanctuaries in northern California.

BOX 33-37

Golden Gate National Recreation Area, 1972-2011

Documents concerning the management of the Golden Gate National Recreation Area and its land tracts and historic sites, which includes Alcatraz Island and penitentiary, Fort Mason, Fort Baker, and Crissy Field. Legislative measures documented include Pelosi's efforts to expand the park's boundaries and an unsuccessful measure to rename the area as "Golden Gate National Parks" in 2008. Files include correspondence, bill drafts, statements, testimonies, reports, and news clippings.

BOX 37-41

Grants, 1993-2006

Correspondence from the Pelosi office informing various San Francisco based organizations and projects of their receipt of grant awards.

BOX 41-45 Hunters Point Naval Shipyard, 1976-2010

Files pertaining to the Defense Base Closure and Realignment Commission's (BRAC) recommendation to close Hunters Point Naval Shipyard and base in 1991 and the subsequent environmental remediation and transfer of property from the Department of Defense to the city of San Francisco. Pelosi's legislative work includes efforts to advocate for artists and tenants on the Hunters Point property prior to and during the closure process in 1991 and later, to secure a no-cost transfer of clean land agreement. Future use and improvement project plans for the Candlestick Point area are also included in this subseries. Files include correspondence, bill amendments, statements, reports, memorandums of agreement, news clippings, and press releases

BOX 45-47 Maritime National Historical Park, 1981-2007

Bills, amendments, statements, and testimonies document Pelosi's efforts to authorize the Maritime National Historical Park as a national historical site in 1988 and to secure lines of funding for the park to restore scrapped ships as part of its mission to preserve American maritime heritage. Correspondence and reports document administrative matters and include advisory board appointments, property lease issues, and a management plan.

BOX 47-49 **Predecessors, 1967-1991**

Records created by previous incumbents of California's 5th and 6th districts before Pelosi was elected representative of the 5th congressional district. Includes material maintained by John L. Burton (1932-), Phillip Burton (1926-1983), and Sala Galant Burton (1925-1987). The John L. Burton file includes records from his campaign for the California State Assembly in 1988. The Phillip Burton file includes press releases, newspaper clippings, and correspondence from his time in Congress, especially the late 1970s, and items concerning his death in 1983. The files of Sala Burton include correspondence, press releases, guest lists, and fundraising information from her run for Congress in a special election to fill her late husband's vacant seat in 1983. Correspondence, newspaper clippings, press releases, and photographs, from her time in office and material from her memorial service after her death in 1987 are also included. Arranged alphabetically by name of person or subject.

BOX 49-73 Presidio, 1979-2011

Files documenting the closure of the Presidio Army base in 1988 and its subsequent redevelopment as a national park jointly managed by the Presidio Trust and National Park Service. Testimonies, statements, correspondence, and reports trace the Defense Base Closure and Realignment Commission's (BRAC) recommendation to close the Presidio Army base in the late 1980s, assess the economic impact on the city of San Francisco, describe plans to deactivate the Sixth Army, and document requirements and plans for environmental cleanup of the base. Records pertaining to future use planning and ultimate transfer of the land to the Department of the Interior in 1994 include newsletters and publications from the National Park Service Presidio Planning Council, correspondence and reports from the Presidio Council, and correspondence and news clippings. Pelosi's efforts to prevent the base from going to auction and to preserve it as a historical site are heavily documented in her legislative work from the 103rd and 104th Congresses. This includes bill drafts, testimonies, hearing materials, and correspondence from Pelosi's initially unsuccessful efforts to establish the Presidio Trust Act during the 103rd Congress and her later successful efforts to sign into law the Presidio Trust Act of 1996 during the 104th Congress. Correspondence, news clippings, publications, and printed materials dated between 1997 and 2001 describe the Presidio Trust and its Board

of Director's management of the park and the development of several structures within the park including the Letterman Complex, the Public Health Hospital, and the Main Post

Arranged alphabetically by subject or material type.

BOX 73-87 **Transportation, 1987-2011**

Records concerning transportation issues and projects in San Francisco and the Bay Area. Major transportation networks represented in this subseries include the Bay Area Rapid Transit system (BART), the San Francisco Municipal Railway (Muni), Caltrain, the San Francisco International Airport (SFO), and the region's various bridges, roadways, and ports. Legislative material pertains primarily to funding for special projects through requests to the Appropriations Committee and through the numerous infrastructure acts and bills authorized in the early 1990s and later 2000s. Projects of note include the BART system's extension to the San Francisco International Airport, the construction and grand opening of the Transbay Transit Center, the San Francisco International Airport's runway reconfiguration project, and the retrofit of several major structures, the Bay Bridge and Golden Gate Bridge among them, to ensure earthquake safety. Files contain correspondence, reports, news clippings, press releases, bills, notes, and printed material.

BOX 87-90 <u>Treasure Island, 1989-2010</u>

Documents relating Naval Station Treasure Island's selection for closure by the Defense Base Closure and Realignment Commission (BRAC) in 1993 and the resulting economic and environmental conveyance requirements. Files describe several redevelopment plans prepared by the Treasure Island Development Authority (TIDA) and negotiations for a no-cost economic development conveyance agreement. The subseries includes correspondence, reports, news clippings, and press releases.

BOX 90-101 **Water Resources, 1984-2008**

Files pertaining to various water management and water quality issues in the San Francisco Bay area and state of California. Includes major projects to mitigate pollution in the San Francisco Bay-Delta-Estuary areas, manage water flows and sourcing from the Hetch Hetchy Valley to San Francisco, and dredging projects in the bay. Legislative materials include Pelosi's efforts to obtain funding from the Water Resources Development and Clean water Acts. Documents include correspondence, reports, news clippings, press releases, and legislative material.

BOX 101-203 Correspondence, 1987-2012

Correspondence groupings, primarily as created by Pelosi's office, originally in a series of binders or sets of folders. Each correspondence set has been separately maintained as a subseries. A Miscellaneous File was created and consists of loose correspondence found in the papers with no clear connection to a particular file. A subseries was also created for the correspondence reports and logs found among the papers. Various categories of correspondents are found mixed together in the Alphabetical, Chronological, and Miscellaneous correspondence subseries.

Arranged alphabetically into ten subseries: Alphabetical File, Chronological File, Co-Signed Letters, Dear Colleague Letters, Issue Mail, Miscellaneous, Recommendation Letters, Reports and Logs, Thank You Letters, and White House.

BOX 101-128 **Alphabetical File, 2004-2012**

Correspondence dating from Pelosi's time as Minority Leader and Speaker of the House. Contains both received letters and copies of outgoing correspondence with a wide range of correspondents: top foreign and national government leaders, ambassadors, fellow members of Congress, top union and business leaders, California politicians, school students, concerned citizens, and personal correspondents.

The 2004-2005 letters are organized alphabetically and the 2007-2012 letters are organized alphabetically by first letter only.

BOX 129-157 Chronological File, 1989-2010

Correspondence dating from 1989 through 2010, with gaps in 1998, between 2001 and 2005, and 2007. Earlier years contain outgoing correspondence attached to incoming letters from a wide range of correspondents: top foreign and national government leaders, ambassadors, fellow members of Congress, top union and business leaders, California politicians, school students, and concerned citizens. Later years primarily have Pelosi's outgoing response only.

Arranged chronologically.

BOX 157-167 Co-Signed Letters, 1991-2008

Letters co-signed by Pelosi and other members of Congress, expressing their mutual stance on an issue before Congress, and sent primarily to other government officials and organizational leaders. Letters are arranged chronologically by year of Congress and by issue thereunder. In some cases, response letters from recipients are included, as are administrative notes from Pelosi's staff regarding compilation of signatures or drafts to a particular letter's content. Later years include spreadsheet summaries documenting the date, office of origin, and addressee of each letter.

BOX 167-168 Dear Colleague Letters, 1988-2006

Letters written by Pelosi to other members of Congress soliciting support for legislation or sending information about a particular issue. In many cases, a receipt from the House postmaster is attached to Pelosi's original copy of the letter.

Arranged chronologically as received in binders.

BOX 168-180 Issue Mail, 1987-2008

Form replies used by Pelosi's office in response to constituent and citizen concerns and inquires regarding particular issues. The subseries is primarily composed of response letters in their final form, though some drafts, notes, and edits by Pelosi and her staff are included. All represent outgoing form replies from Pelosi's office, with the exception of one 2007 file, which contains messages from citizens regarding the war in Iraq and President Bush. Researchers may wish to reference the Reports and logs subseries to see weekly counts by issue of pending form replies in response to constituent and citizen communication with the office between 2003 and 2006.

BOX 180-186 Miscellaneous, 1987-2012

Miscellaneous incoming and outgoing correspondence found in the papers with no clear connection to a particular file. Dates range from 1989 to 2012, though the file is replete with gaps. Correspondence between Pelosi and other members of Congress comprise the majority of both incoming and outgoing correspondence, though some incoming constituent correspondence is included.

BOX 186-193 Recommendation Letters, 1992-2008

Correspondence regarding Pelosi's recommendations for political appointments, primarily for President Clinton's first and second terms, dating between 1992 and 1998. Also included is a small number of recommendations for President Obama's first term in 2008 and a miscellaneous file of recommendations for high level appointments within federal organizations and the state of California.

Arranged alphabetically.

BOX 193-196 Reports and Logs, 2003-2011

Assorted correspondence logs and reports maintained in various forms by Pelosi's office between 2003 and 2011. Material dating between 2008 and 2010 represent bimonthly reports compiled by staff summarizing incoming correspondence from notable actors, entertainers, world leaders, and personalities, and include mail from Barbra Streisand, Richard Gere, Bill Gates, and Tony Bennett, among others. In most cases, the original correspondence is attached to the report. The logs in this subseries are primarily digests of constituent and citizen correspondence dating between 2003 and 2006, though the file contains gaps in the dates. Listed in the logs are weekly counts by issue of pending form reply letters prepared in response to constituent and citizen communication. Researchers may wish to consult the Issue mail subseries to see the form replies referenced in the reports.

BOX 196-202 Thank You Letters, 1987-2010

Thank you notes and letters dating between 1987 and 2010. Primarily notes and letters sent to Nancy from a wide range of correspondents: top foreign and national government leaders, ambassadors, fellow members of Congress, Democratic party leaders, business leaders, California politicians, school students, constituents, and citizens.

Arranged chronologically.

BOX 202-203 White House, 1993-2000

Letters and thank you notes from the Clinton White House. Primarily letters from President Clinton to Pelosi, but the file also includes letters from First Lady Hillary Rodham Clinton, Vice President Al Gore, and White House staff members.

DF **Digital Files, 1989-2013**

Born-digital textual documents, image files, audio files, and video files, as well as scanned text and image files, arranged into two subseries. The General Files were copied from the Pelosi offices' server and are independent of the paper files. Withdrawn Files are from digital storage media removed from paper files in the course of processing. A cross reference to the original location in the paper files is provided for each of the Withdrawn Files. Request files using the digital ID.

Arranged alphabetically by subseries: General Files and Withdrawn Files from the Paper Collection.

General Files, 1999-2013

Digital files copied from the Pelosi office's server. The bulk of the files relate to events, scheduling, press and communications, the House Democratic Caucus, and various issues. Files primarily consist of born digital textual documents, as well as image files, some audio files, and scanned text files and images. Schedules, memoranda, email, events, photographs, biographical information, talking points, planning files,

background, research, clippings, press releases, media advisories, statements, mailers, clippings, transcripts, speeches, and interviews. Request files using the digital ID. Arranged alphabetically by topic or subject.

Withdrawn Files from the Paper Collection, 1989-2010

Primarily video and image files of Pelosi's participation in various events and matters of interest to Pelosi's constituents. Also includes reports and newsletters. Withdrawn files are from 3.5" floppy disks, 5.25" floppy disks, and optical disks removed from paper files in the course of processing. A cross reference to the original location in the paper files is provided for each file. Request files using the digital ID.

Arranged and described according to the series, containers, and folders from which the digital storage media were removed.

Events and Scheduling, 1987-2010

Speeches, itineraries, schedules, calendars, and chronologically arranged folders of Pelosi public events that usually include planning material, speech notes, and items from the event. Also included is a large file for the 2009 Presidential inauguration.

Arranged alphabetically into two subseries: Chronological File and Speech File.

Documentation of speaking appearances, awards and honors, charity events, meetings, celebrations, ceremonies, fundraisers, congressional meetings, conferences, forums, and campaign events. Also includes daily schedules and invitations to serve on boards or honorary committees. Dates of files oftentimes refer to the date of the event, however, files will typically include documentation of plans leading up to the event or follow-up activities. Prominent files include those related to women's rights, AIDS, the LGBT community, human rights, the Dalai Lama, and Inauguration Day 2009. Material types include speeches, itineraries, planning files, correspondence, schedules, calendars, agendas, meeting requests, invitations, statements, remarks, and programs.

Arranged chronologically.

BOX 247-260 Speeches, 1994-2010

Primarily files of staff speechwriters containing speeches, written statements, commencement addresses, remarks, floor statements, tributes, and remembrances, mostly from 2005 to 2010. The speeches are associated with a wide range of events including roundtables, conference appearances, press conferences, and memorial services. Files sometimes contain additional documentation of the events for which the speeches were written. Oftentimes, additional information related to the event is located in the Chronological File.

Arranged alphabetically by subject and/or speechwriter name and chronologically therein.

BOX 260-286 <u>Leadership File, 1985-2009</u>

Primarily material from Pelosi's campaigns for leadership positions and the assumption of leadership positions in the House of Representatives, but also includes files concerning duties and activities of leadership, such as committee assignments, member services, and as Speaker, her role in the State of the Union address and parliamentarian procedure. Several binders of correspondence and related information document legislative priorities of Pelosi's Speakership. The file includes correspondence, speeches, handwritten notes by Pelosi, telephone call logs, staff memoranda and binders, House vote polling, press coverage, invitations, photographs, and other memorabilia from swearing-in ceremonies. Files pertaining to Pelosi's predecessors in leadership positions are also contained in this series and include files created by Thomas Foley in his role as Speaker of the House

between 1989 and 1995, and files from House Majority Leader Richard Gephardt dating between 1989 and 1991.

Arranged alphabetically by subject.

BOX 286-679 **Legislative File, 1983-2011**

Files related to Pelosi's role in the legislative process in the United States House of Representatives. Documents include correspondence, briefing material, issue files, legislative activity guides, reports, financial material, itineraries, schedules, floor statements, floor operations, and travel files.

Organized alphabetically into nine subseries: Appropriations, Committees and Caucuses, Congressional Delegations, Congressional Working Group on China, Floor Operations, Floor Statements, Issues File, Legislative Activity Guides, and Staff Files.

BOX 286-367 **Appropriations, 1983-2011**

The Appropriations subseries includes papers from Pelosi's work as a member of the Appropriations Committee as well as her work to obtain funding for various projects, especially items of importance to her home district in San Francisco. The process of allocating government funds by yearly fiscal budgets is documented in the correspondence and memoranda with members of Congress, various organizations, California government officials, executive branch officials, other committee members, and with Pelosi staff members. Many of the documents were organized into binders designated as "Projects," "Programs," or by one of the Appropriations subcommittee names. The Appropriations subseries also includes folders titled "Pelosi campaign for committee membership" relating the Congresswoman's 1988 and 1990 lobbying of House members for an appointment to the powerful Appropriations Committee. Material dating from 1983-1987 originated in Sala Burton's office, Pelosi's predecessor from the 5th Congressional district of California.

Arranged by fiscal years. Files from a fiscal year date from the year before, when requests are made and considered, to the year of the fiscal year, when supplemental appropriations are determined.

BOX 367-385 Committees and Caucuses, 1987-2010

Files reflecting Pelosi's work with various House committees and caucuses. Documents from her tenure on the Ethics Committee (known as the House Committee on Standards of Conduct until the 112th Congress) include files on numerous ethics investigations of fellow House members, including a substantial file on the Newt Gingrich inquiry between 1995 and 1997. Papers from the Permanent Select Committee on Intelligence include items pertaining to Pelosi's appointment to the committee, the 1994 Aldrich Ames espionage case, and documents from the committee's 1993-1994 inquiry into the changing role of the Central Intelligence Agency (CIA) in the post-Cold War era. The Ways and Means Committee file was compiled by a Pelosi staff member; Pelosi never served on the committee. The most notable of the caucus files is the House Democratic Caucus which documents conferences, forums, roundtables, and highlights many of the initiatives pursued by the Democratic Party including the "Innovation Agenda," "New Direction for America," and "New Partnership for America's Future."

Arranged alphabetically by committee or caucus name and by subject therein.

BOX 385-398 Congressional Delegations, 1987-2008

Files related to Pelosi's many trips with Congressional delegations including delegations associated with the North Atlantic Assembly's trips between 1987 and 1990. Schedules, itineraries, briefing materials, information kits, and expense reports.

Arranged chronologically.

BOX 398-435 Congressional Working Group on China, 1986-2003

The Congressional Working Group on China was organized by Pelosi in 1989 in response to the Tienanmen Square Massacre and President Bush's veto of the Chinese Student bill later that same year. Pelosi formed the bipartisan group to review ways to improve U.S.-China relations and to promote human rights causes. Later, the group expanded its agenda to focus on weapons proliferation and trade practices with China. Of particular interest to the Working Group were the most favored nation (MFN) and free trade agreements. Pelosi's staff maintained the records of congressional China trade debates of the 1990s in chronological binders documenting both sides of the debate and Pelosi's efforts to require conditions for renewing MFN status for China. Also documented in this subseries is Pelosi's response to the human rights crisis in Tibet, her efforts to assist Chinese students studying in the United States, and other efforts to advocate for human rights. Files include copies of bills, statements, dear colleague letters from legislators arguing for and against the extension, correspondence, press releases, and newsletters outlining position statements of various nonprofit human rights groups, clippings documenting actions taken by the Clinton administration, correspondence between Pelosi and other legislators and interested organizations, and material documenting hearings held before the Ways and Means Committee.

Arranged alphabetically by topic or material type.

BOX 435-457 **Floor Operations, 2000-2012**

Files maintained by Pelosi's director of floor operations, Jerry Hartz. This subseries is arranged as received and includes vote projections, final vote counts, correspondence, press releases, dear colleague letters, agendas, legislative summaries, and memoranda to Pelosi reflecting Hartz's major duties to help coordinate Democratic votes and actions on the House floor. Prominent legislative efforts documented include healthcare and energy bills.

Arranged alphabetically by subject.

Floor Statements, 1987-2004

Compiled floor statements made by Pelosi, beginning with her first Congress in 1987 up through the 108th Congress, 2003-2004.

Arranged chronologically by Congress.

BOX 463-654 **Issues File, 1985-2011**

Files on major legislative issues addressed by Pelosi and her staff between 1987 and 2011, with the majority of files dating between 2000 and 2011. Organized into broad issue files such as health, the environment, foreign policy, and energy as well as by the name of major legislative measures such as the Homeland Security Act and the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act. Also in this subseries are files on the Clinton impeachment proceedings. In some cases, a particular issue is divided into a "general file" and "staff file." The "staff file" is a discrete file group on that issue compiled by a certain staff member. Documents include correspondence, bills, statements, press releases, clippings, printed matter, and notes.

Arranged alphabetically by issue.

BOX 654-657 Legislative Activity Guides, 1999-2007

Compiled guides and profiles reflecting Pelosi's legislative activity during a given Congress. Legislative guides are prepared by the Office of Legislative Operations and summarize Pelosi's voting record, while the legislative profiles are prepared by the Office of

Legislative Information and summarize sponsored and cosponsored measures and amendments.

Arranged chronologically by Congress.

BOX 658-679 **Staff Files, 1995-2011**

A set of discrete files created by individual Pelosi staff members and maintained in this subseries as separate staff files. These files concern the legislative and budgetary process and office matters in contrast to the topical staff files found in the issues file subseries. The file created by Chief of Staff, John A. Lawrence, ranges from 2007 through 2009 and documents matters specific to the Pelosi office's role as the office of Speaker of the House. Topics of note include the 2008 and 2009 stimulus package and the 2008 automobile industry bailout.

Arranged alphabetically by staff member.

BOX 679-685 **Personal File, 1930-2010**

The Personal File is composed of family and personal papers, family and miscellaneous photographs, and files on awards and activities not connected to Pelosi's congressional duties. Associations include the Kennedy Center Board of Trustees, the Botanical Garden Board of Trustees, and the National Italian American Foundation. Conferences include G.L.O.B.E., and the Bilderberg Meetings. Artifacts and photographs of Pelosi with no clear connection to another file have been gathered into this series. The photographs file includes images from events, with staff, and with notable figures and world leaders. Artifacts are all housed in the Oversize series. A small set of family papers includes correspondence from Pelosi's children and grandchildren, materials pertaining to a family trip to Africa and other family events, newspaper clippings, tributes to her mother and father, and photographs of Pelosi and her brothers as children. Many of the photographs and clippings in the family papers relate to Pelosi's father, Thomas D'Alesandro, former congressman and mayor of Baltimore, Maryland.

Arranged alphabetically by topic or type of material.

BOX 685-704 **Political File, 1980-2011**

Papers concerning political campaigns, fundraising trips and events, political messaging for the Democratic party, material from the Democratic National Conventions, the Democratic National Committee and the Democratic Congressional Campaign Committee. As a member of the House leadership, and while positioning herself to run for a leadership position, Pelosi raised campaign money nationally and distributed funds to many Democratic members of Congress. The series also includes material pertaining to various California political issues including the 2003 recall election of Governor Gray Davis and the resulting governorship of Arnold Schwarzenegger. Correspondence, briefing books, financial and fundraising material, contacts lists, notes, and printed matter.

Arranged alphabetically by type of material or subject matter.

BOX 704-722 Press and Communications, 1985-2011

The series contains communications put out by Pelosi's office, editorials by Pelosi, news clippings about Pelosi, press conference and interview transcripts, and files relating to Pelosi's memoir *Know Your Power* which contain publicity, reviews, and a draft of the opening. Most of the mailers include newsletters and information sent to constituents focusing on individual issues such as social security, education, and healthcare. Similar to the mailers are the "Facts by Fax" press releases, news, and related documents that were faxed to constituents between 1996 and 2000. Staff files, especially those from communications directory Brendan Daly, focus on messaging, outreach, and communications strategy. Files contain clippings, mailers, press releases, statements,

tributes, editorials, press conference transcripts, talking points, interviews, press contacts lists, and Pelosi website information.

BOX R 723 Restricted, 2007

U.S. Senate Committee on Energy and Natural Resources committee prints with annotations. Organized and described according to the series, container, and folders from which the items were removed.

BOX X 724 Closed, 1995-2009

The Appropriations subseries also includes folders titled "Pelosi campaign for committee membership" relating the Congresswoman's 1988 and 1990 lobbying of House members for an appointment to the powerful Appropriations Committee. Material dating from 1983-1987 originated in Sala Burton's office, Pelosi's predecessor from the 5th Congressional district of California.
