Summary: United States representative and senator from Massachusetts. Correspondence, memoranda, letterbooks, diaries, speeches, reports, notebooks, biographical material, family papers, photographs, citations, congressional commissions, scrapbooks, clippings, printed matter, and an incomplete biography of Dawes by his daughter, Anna Laurens Dawes. The collection documents mainly Dawes's career as a federal legislator and his work on issues relating to the American Indian, including his tenure as chairman of the Commission to the Five Civilized Tribes.

The papers of Henry L. Dawes, United States representative and senator from Massachusetts, were given to the Library of Congress in 1931 and 1932 by his daughter, Anna L. Dawes. Additional material was received from the estate of Anna L. Dawes between 1940-1944 and as a gift from the William R. Perkins Library, Duke University, in 1987.

Processing History

The papers of Henry L. Dawes were arranged and described in 1962. An addition of a letter from Dawes to S. D. Brooks, dated 1861, was interfiled in the General Correspondence in 1987. The finding aid was revised in 2012.

Scope and Content Note

The papers of Henry Laurens Dawes (1816-1903) span the years 1833-1933, with the bulk of the material dating from 1833 to 1903. The collection documents primarily Dawes's service as a United States representative and United States senator from Massachusetts and his tenure as chairman of the Commission to the Five Civilized Tribes. The papers are in English and are organized into the following series: <u>Family Papers</u>, <u>General Correspondence</u>, <u>Autograph Correspondence</u> <u>Collection</u>, <u>Letterbooks</u>, <u>Personal File</u>, <u>Biography File</u>, <u>Speeches</u>, <u>Indian Affairs</u>, <u>Miscellany</u>, <u>Scrapbooks</u>, and <u>Oversize</u>.

The <u>Family Papers</u> consist mainly of Dawes's correspondence with other family members and his wife, Electa Allen Sanderson Dawes. Also included in these papers are diaries of Henry L. Dawes and those of his daughter, Anna Laurens Dawes, and Electa S. Dawes. This series also includes correspondence and other papers of Anna. An unfinished and unpublished manuscript of a biography of her father by Anna is in the <u>Biography File</u>.

Throughout Dawes's public career, he worked on issues relating to the American Indian, and this work is documented in his papers. Also reflected in the papers are his connections with Oakes Ames, a congressman; Credit Mobilier of America, a railroad construction company; the George Chorpenning claim case; and his involvement with the United States Weather Bureau, the tariff, and Gallaudet College in the District of Columbia.

Of special interest are the <u>Speeches</u> and <u>Indian Affairs</u> series. The former contain his early speeches and include reminiscences of his service in Congress and the federal government, sketches of prominent men, the civil service and tariffs, Reconstruction, Indian affairs, and political campaigns and conventions. The <u>Indian Affairs</u> series contains correspondence, copies of House and Senate bills and legislative documents, and pamphlets, newspaper clippings, and miscellaneous material relating to Dawes's concern with Indians, specifically in his role as a member of the Senate Committee on Indian Affairs and later as chairman of the Commission to the Five Civilized Tribes (also known as the Dawes Commission) in the Indian Territory.
