Summary: Katherine Dunham (1909-2006) was an American dancer, choreographer, teacher, dance anthropologist, and writer. The collection contains correspondence, awards and honors, writings by and about Dunham, business papers, photographs and videotapes, clippings and reviews, programs, promotional materials, and materials related to the Library of Congress Katherine Dunham Legacy Project.

Custodial History

In 2000, the Library of Congress was awarded a grant of \$1 million from the Doris Duke Charitable Foundation for the purpose of undertaking the Katherine Dunham Legacy Project. Project activities included the purchase of the Katherine Dunham archives; preservation of the materials that documented and augmented the Dunham legacy; auxiliary programs that assisted the Katherine Dunham Centers in East Saint Louis and Dunham workshops; video documentation of the Dunham technique and interviews of Dunham; and creation of the Dunham website at the Library of Congress (available at http://lcweb2.loc.gov/diglib/ihas/html/dunham/dunham-home.html).

Moving images were received in 2001; the remaining items in the Collection were transferred to the Library after Dunham's death in 2006. Since 2011, additional materials have been and continue to be added to the Collection through gifts and purchases.

Processing History

The Katherine Dunham Collection was initially processed by Elizabeth Aldrich in 2010. The finding aid was updated and revised by Aldrich in 2011. In 2017, the Collection was reorganized by Libby Smigel and Alicia Patterson with input from Dunham scholars. Smigel and Patterson completed the coding of the finding aid for EAD format in March 2018.

Transfers

The Katherine Dunham Collection's moving image and sound recordings were transferred to the Motion Picture, Broadcasting and Recorded Sound (MBRS) Division, where they are now identified as part of the Dunham (Katherine) Collection (MAVIS collection no. 12337). An inventory of this material is available in the Music Division's collection file. The recordings include interviews, performances, research trips, and demonstrations of the Dunham technique.

Other Repositories

Southern Illinois University, Carbondale, has the Katherine Dunham Papers, 1919-1968, within which are photographs, correspondence, films and sound recordings, scrapbooks, and other materials documenting Dunham's life and career through 1968. The Missouri History Museum Library and Research Center in St. Louis has a collection of Dunham material, which contains materials donated by Dunham in 1992 that document her time in East St. Louis from 1967 to 1992.

The University of California, Irvine, has a photograph collection on Dunham that includes photographic prints, proofs, contact sheets, and postcards, rehearsals, portraits publicity efforts, and candid moments. The collection also contains typewritten letters concerning payment for photographs and other logistical matters of her company. The New York Public Library for the Performing Arts Dance Division holds some scrapbooks, concert programs, and other materials relating to Dunham and her company.

Related Material

The Alvin Ailey Dance Foundation collection in the Library of Congress Music Division includes Dunham materials, including documentation of the "Magic of Katherine Dunham" program. Also in the Music Division, the <u>Federal Theatre Project Collection</u> contains photographs from Dunham's original 1938 production of *L'Ag'Ya*, performed by the Ballet Fedré in Chicago, and the Victoria Phillips Collection has a copy of the FBI file on Katherine Dunham.

The Motion Picture, Broadcasting and Recorded Sound (MBRS) Division at the Library of Congress holds many interviews of Katherine Dunham and performances of her company and school in television programs and other media sources. The Library of Congress Prints and Photograph Division holds a number of photographs of Katherine Dunham (portraits, rehearsals, and others) and the Library of Congress Rare Book Division holds a number of rare performance playbills, which can be found by using the Library of Congress online catalog.

Scope and Content Note

The Katherine Dunham Collection consists of a large set of **Subject Files** related to people and organizations related to Dunham's career, **Photographs** of personal and professional subjects, **Correspondence** both formal and informal, records of special **Awards** and recognition of Dunham's achievements, **Writings** by Dunham herself and by others, **Production Materials** and **Clippings** that document her creative work, moving images and sound recordings purchased by the Library of Congress as part of the Katherine Dunham Legacy Project, funded by the Doris Duke Charitable Foundation. These materials, which date from the mid-1930s, were received between 2002 and 2004 and contain examples of Dunham's original field research in the Caribbean, numerous performances, and tapes of the Dunham Technique seminars. After Dunham's death in 2006, manuscript materials that were found in her New York City apartment were transferred to the Library of Congress. Most of the manuscript materials that document Katherine Dunham's career had been transferred during the 1960s and 1970s to the Missouri Historical Society and the University of Southern Illinois.

Highlights of the Katherine Dunham Collection include moving image footage from Haiti, Trinidad, Martinique, and Jamaica (mid-1930s); and Dunham works *Primitive Rhythms* (late 1980s); *Floyd's Guitar Blues* (no date); *Casbah* and *Star Spangled Rhythm* (no date); rehearsals of *Southland* (1981); *Mambo* (1950); and numerous examples of Dunham in performance and interviews with Dunham.

Other materials housed in the Collection include original photographs; the U.S. State Department's reaction to Dunham and her trip to Senegal in 1966 (obtained via the Freedom of Information Act); and numerous manuscript examples of Dunham's writing. The Collection also documents the activities conducted as part of the Library of Congress **Katherine Dunham Legacy Project**, undertaken with a \$1 million grant from the Doris Duke Charitable Foundation.

Almost all of the moving image and sound recordings were transferred to the Motion Picture, Broadcasting and Recorded Sound Division. One exception is a personal set of VHS-format **Videotapes** donated after the Legacy Project was completed; these were retained in the Collection for the convenience of the library patron.

BOX 1-9 Subject Files, 1934-2006, and undated

Materials relating to individuals, professional associations and cultural centers, and other organizations.

Arranged alphabetically.

BOX 18-22 Writings, 1946-2007

Includes biographical, scholarly, and creative writing by Katherine Dunham and others, some published, and in the case of Dunham's writings some unpublished or in various stages of revision. Texts of two commencement addresses given by Dunham are included.

Arranged in two subseries. The Writings by Katherine Dunham subseries is arranged alphabetically by title. The Writings by Others subseries is arranged alphabetically by author or editor.

Informal and official letters, faxes, notes and cards, along with occasional laid-in items. Where the correspondent is not fully identified, as in fan mail or holiday cards, these missives are grouped together.

Arranged alphabetically by organization or last name, or grouped among a type of informal correspondence as in fan mail or invitations that were largely unanswered.

BOX 13-16, 29 Photographs, 1940-2006

Photographs, slides, and reprints including photocopies of personal, professional, and performance subjects.

Arranged alphabetically by name of primary subject.

BOX 30 <u>Videotapes</u>, 1942-2007

Eight VHS recordings of Katherine Dunham works, intended as onsite reference copies when using the Dunham special collection. Date indicates release date, not date of the issue of the VHS format. Donated to the collection by Claude Conyers.

BOX 23-24 Awards, 1979-2005

Medals, certificates, programs, and items such as correspondence related to awards conferred upon Dunham.

BOX 25-28 Katherine Dunham Legacy Project, 1987-2005

The Doris Duke Charitable Trust funded the Library of Congress to undertake activities to coordinate the preservation of significant Katherine Dunham records and create an access plan. This series contains the records of planning the project, the proposal and funding records of the DDCT grant, and the preservation activities. Items include inventories of audio and video recordings, indexes to Dunham holdings at other repositories such as Southern Illinois University and the Dunham Museum, and conservation assessments, as well as the video documentation project on Dunham Technique, among many other materials.
