Summary: Conductor, composer, and arranger John Philip Sousa shared a portion of his early music library with fellow band conductor, composer, and arranger Victor Grabel, a small section of which comprises this collection. The materials include arrangements and transcriptions of songs, arias, overtures, dances, and suites created for the Sousa Band, printed arrangements, and original compositions by Sousa and Grabel. The works are chiefly represented by printed and manuscript parts.

Custodial History

John Philip Sousa began the music library for his Sousa Band in 1892, which was lost in litigation to the widow of his manager David Blakely in 1900 and then sold back to Sousa in 1924. Sousa picked out a few works, then gave the rest of this music to fellow band director Victor Grabel in 1931. Grabel used the music with his Chicago Concert Band and added to the collection. He sold a small portion of the music to Louis M. Blaha, band director at J. Sterling Morton High School in Cicero, Illinois. (The high school later gave this music to the Library of Congress.) Grabel kept the <u>majority of the music</u> and took it with him to Stetson University in Deland, Florida, in the 1940s, which was then given to the United States Marine Band in 1969.

Accruals

No further accruals are expected.

Processing History

Jane Cross, Anthony Edwards, and Loras Schissel processed the Music of the Sousa Band and Victor Grabel and coded the finding aid in 2022.

Other Repositories

The United States Marine Band holds the majority of the music that John Philip Sousa gave to Victor Grabel.

Victor Grabel

Conductor, music educator, arranger, and author Victor Jean Grabel was born in Kauffman County, Texas, in 1886. A cornetist, he attended Texas Christian College and later became student leader of the band. Grabel completed further studies at the Dana School of Music in Warren, Ohio, where he studied composition, arranging, and cornet under B. D. Gilliland. In 1906, Grabel enlisted in the U.S. Army and was made bandmaster of the 7th U.S. Infantry. He and his band were stationed for four years in the Philippine Islands, during which time he began creating his own arrangements and transcriptions and composing original works. In 1914, he married Mary Sinclair of Chicago. During World War I, Grabel enlisted in the U.S. Navy's band program and was assigned as an assistant to John Philip Sousa at Naval Station Great Lakes near Chicago. Grabel was later assigned to the USS Pennsylvania, which transported President Woodrow Wilson to Europe at the conclusion of hostilities.

After the war, Grabel returned to the Chicago area where he lead various bands and acted as an adjudicator for music contests at both the local and national level. Beginning in 1923, he led the Western Electric Corporation Band in Cicero, Illinois, and organized his first professional band in Chicago. In 1928, while judging a high school band contest in Columbus, Ohio, fellow bandmaster Edwin Franko Goldman first discussed plans to organize the American Bandmasters' Association with Grabel and then-leader of the U.S. Army Band, William J. Stannard. Grabel was later named secretary of the organization and authored numerous articles about bands and band music for *Etude* magazine under the auspices of the organization. He formed the Chicago Concert Band, which performed regularly in Grant Park and at Symphony Hall, and was named music director of the Chicagoland Music Festival. During World War II, he was named conductor of the Stetson University Band in Deland, Florida. Suffering from ill health, Grabel retired in the late 1940s and returned home to Texas where he died in a Veterans Hospital in 1965. He was buried in Mineral Wells, Texas. His transcription of the overture to Richard Wagner's *Reinzi* was recorded by Frederick Fennell and the Eastman Symphonic Wind Ensemble in 1961.

Scope and Content Note

The Music of the Sousa Band and Victor Grabel dates from 1861 to 1954 with the bulk of the materials ranging from 1880 to 1933. Arrangements and transcriptions of songs, arias, overtures, dances, and suites created for the Sousa Band chiefly comprise the collection, which also includes printed arrangements and several original compositions by John Philip Sousa and Victor Grabel. Most notable among these are the manuscript parts for Sousa's *The Chariot Race, In Parlour and Street*, and *Songs of Grace and Songs of Glory*, as well as Grabel's "Parade of the Tinker Toys" and "United We Stand." Well-known arrangers in addition to Sousa and Grabel represented in the collection include Herbert L. Clarke, Giuseppe (Joseph) Boccavecchia, J. B. Claus, and Sir Daniel Eyers Godfrey. The materials primarily consist of printed and manuscript parts. In many instances, printed piano-vocal scores are included with the manuscript band parts.
